JUNIOR CLUB RULES

Meopham Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well being of all its members. The club believes that it is important that members, coaches, parents and volunteers associated with the club should, at all times, show respect, be encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club.

As a member of Meopham Cricket Club you are expected to abide by the following junior club rules:

- All members must play within the Laws of cricket and in the spirit of the game
- All members must respect colleagues, opponents and officials. Do not make rude comments about them.
- Be polite to umpires and respect their decisions. Do not show dissent
- All members should keep to given timings for training and competitions. They must inform their coach or team manager at the earliest possible opportunity if they cannot play or if they are going to be late for an arranged match.
- All members must wear suitable kit (gloves, pads, helmet, box (for boys) for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager. The club has a limited number of these items but individuals are asked to bring their own box.
- ALL PLAYERS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 MUST WEAR HELMETS WHEN BATTING AND WHEN STANDING UP TO THE STUMPS WHEN WICKET KEEPING. Anyone wishing to bat or keep wicket without a helmet must have written permission from their parent/guardian.
- All members must pay any fees for membership or matches promptly
- Junior members not allowed to smoke or consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club

CHILD PROTECTION

If you have Child Protection concerns you should:

- Report any information or concerns to the Club Welfare Officer
- Ensure that you have obtained as much information about your concerns
- Complete an ECB Cricket Incident Form and submit it to the Club or County Welfare Officer accompanied by any umpire reports or witness statements
- If any young person is in danger or has been hurt, the matter must be reported.
